Fire Inspector

Performs as a Fire Inspector and Prevention Officer to provide fire protection and prevention services. Work schedule is 9 hrs on duty, five days a week. Occasional shift work of 24 hours on duty and 24 hours off duty may be required. **Duties/responsibilities:** Assists the Fire Chief in the following tasks: Fire Investigations. Fire Safety Inspections. Other duties as assigned. Ensure proper fire fighting tactics are employed. Assist in prioritizing fire fighting and medical aid tasks. Responds to requests for service, all (fire, EMS, special rescue) emergencies and performs and participates in the proper mitigation of same. Teaches Fire Prevention, and other topics as required. Maintains all resources, in a state of readiness. Participate in development, installation emergency and/or disaster response exercises, and operations planning committees and meetings. Creates and maintains fire prevention program, inspection schedules, fire inspection reports and records. This position has been designated as “emergency essential” by DOD, and is therefore required, as a condition of employment, to take the series of anthrax vaccine immunizations to include annual boosters. This would include other immunizations that may in the future be required for this position, or for a position that employee may fill as an emergency-essential alternate. Failure to take the immunizations may lead to removal of employee from this position. All applicable: Dept. of Def., Dept. of State, and other Federal documents, (i.e. Directives, Instructions, & “Requirements for Emergency Essential Employees”) will be followed by employee & employer. **Education Level:** High School graduate, with some college preferred. Technical training in firefighting. Department of Defense, ProBoard, or International Fire Service Accreditation Congress certified Fire Officer II, Instructor II, Inspector III, Haz-Mat Operation & IC. EMT – B or better. **Experience:** Minimum 5 years firefighting experience in the U.S. military, Department of Defense, or as a civilian, or 3 years firefighting experience and an associate degree or higher.

Trainer, Paramedic

Designs, develops, evaluates, and revises Programs of Instruction and related materials pertaining to ancillary medical services, allied health sciences and military skills development to support the Allied Health Sciences Military School curriculum development. Develops medical, ancillary medical and military tasks training materials for Programs of Instruction as directed by the Commander, AHSMS or his designated representative. **Duties/Responsibilities:** Supervises the directed hire instructor cadre at the Allied Health Sciences Military School using guidelines and directives approved by the school commander & as directed by the Manager, Allied Health Sciences Education Branch. Monitors the professional qualifications and certification status of

the directed hire instructor cadre and coordinate resolution of continuing education and re-certification requirements for AHSMS faculty members as required. Teaches didactic and practical classes in EMT skills and related subject matter at the basic level or higher as assigned. Prepares and reviews material for class presentation, receives training aids and equipment for conducting classes, corrects homework and examinations, performs student counseling, and prepares lesson plans with related course materials as required. Supervises and directs performance of administrative tasks delegated to instructors, and performs other tasks as required. Serves as team leader/instructor as part of a Mobile Training Team when required. Performs design and development of Programs of Instruction and related materials within his area of expertise as directed. Coaches and assists the AHSMS staff in the review and revision of existing POI and related material within his area of expertise as directed. Develops, reviews and revises Programs of Instruction, lesson plan packages, training plans, and related materials for accuracy and conformance to current military medical doctrine and appropriate medical treatment standards. Coordinates and provides input for course/lesson plan revision based on lessons learned during courses and training programs. Conducts subject matter research and provides technical subject matter expert input for medical doctrine and curriculum development activities. Assists designated AHSMS course supervisors in performing coordination with other AHSMS staff and faculty elements and designated training and training support sites. Accounts for usage of medical supplies, training aids/equipment, office supplies, training supplies. **Education Level:** Associate of Applied Sciences or higher-level education program for Emergency Medical Technicians (Paramedic). A combination of five (5) years technical training and experience is acceptable in lieu of formal education requirement. Current certification in accordance with US Department of Transportation National Traffic Safety Board standards as EMT-P (Paramedic). Current certifications in Basic Life Support (BLS), Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS) and Pre-hospital Life Support (PHTLS) or its equivalent. Instructor certifications for BLS, ACLS, Advanced Medical Life Support (AMLS), and Pediatric Education for Pre-Hospital Professional (PEPP) or its equivalent must be obtained within first 6 months of employment and maintained throughout employment. **Experience:** Five (5) years of experience as an EMT-Paramedic. At least two (2) years of experience in providing emergency medical services –related instruction or training to include assessing clinical skills.

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
