

Fire Protection Safety/Training Specialist

Topeka - 190th Air Refueling Wing. Responsible for the fire department's training, safety, and prevention programs for staff of 17. Also performs fire fighting & EMS duties as needed. The incumbent independently plans and carries out assigned responsibilities. Executes the program for the training of fire and emergency services personnel of Federal, State, military, local municipal departments (under mutual aid agreements), and other related agencies. Program encompasses Structural Firefighting, Aircraft Crash Rescue Firefighting, Aircraft Egress Drills, National Incident Management System (NIMS), Hazardous Material Response (HAZMAT), Weapons of Mass Destruction Response (WMD), Nuclear Biological Chemical (NBC), Emergency Medical Service (EMS) and specialized rescue techniques. Provides instruction in all areas of training in order to obtain and maintain proficiency in DoD Certification for the various levels of Firefighter Certification requirements. Assures all personnel are certified to required DoD F&ES levels of training and certification. Coordinates and administers organizational Drivers and Flightline Training Program. Prepares detailed lesson plans and must have sound communication & organization skills.

IFSAC, Pro-Board or DoD certification as a Fire Fighter II, Airport Fire Fighter and Hazmat Operations, Fire Officer II, Fire Instructor II, and Hazardous Materials Incident Command at time of hire. NREMT and Driver Operator (Pumper, ARFF and Tender) certification within 1 year of hire; Inspector I within 18 Months; National Fire Academy Incident Safety Officer and American Heart Association CPR Instructor within 24 months. Additionally, incumbent must obtain or hold a security clearance of Secret or higher, KS DL-class A or B and pass a pre-employment physical. Must complete and/or maintain designated training, certifications and physical requirements as conditions of employment.

Personnel employed in this position who are deficient in the listed certifications will remain in a probationary status pending completion of certification(s) in stated time frame contentious of agency deviation.
